Dear École Agnes Davidson Parents/Guardians,

Re: "All Day – Alternating Days Kindergarten" Pilot Schools

We are excited to share that Galbraith Elementary, Park Meadows Elementary, Fleetwood Bawden Elementary, École Agnes Davidson (one English and one French) and possibly Coalbanks Elementary (pending parent interest) will be participating in the Lethbridge School District No. 51, "All Day Kindergarten Pilot- Alternating Days" for the upcoming 2019/20 Kindergarten School Year.

The "All Day Kindergarten Pilot" was initiated due to voiced parent interest and feedback. Many parents have shared their struggle with picking up their child mid-day to accommodate half-day kindergarten programming. The "All Day- Alternating Days Kindergarten Pilot" is a structure that two other schools in Lethbridge School District No.51 have already been successfully offering. Rather than provide the current model of four half days a week (Monday through Thursday) the "All Day- Alternating Days Kindergarten Pilot" schools will provide 2 full days of programming, either Monday and Wednesdays or Tuesday and Thursdays.

Both half-day kindergarten and all-day kindergarten have benefits. Both programs will provide the same amount of instructional time to students.

"All Day – Alternating Days Kindergarten" can present fewer transitions for students (i.e. School-Daycare-Home vs. School-Home). Feedback from teachers who have a full-day kindergarten program versus a half-day kindergarten program indicate that their students are more ready for grade one due to the endurance building that naturally occurs in this scenario. Because "All Day Kindergarten" is all day, teachers have also indicated students may have more opportunities for social development and learning through lunch and recess time that does not present in the same way in the half-day program. Traditionally, our Kindergarten programs have met with tremendous success with the AM or PM program offering but we are excited to offer this pilot for the 2019-2020 school year.

We will monitor and support our pilot schools as necessary with the hopes that this opportunity will be helpful for many of our families and most importantly continue to support success and joy for our Kindergarten students in Lethbridge School District No. 51.

At École Agnes Davidson we will be offering the following programs:

- 1 AM French Immersion Kindergarten Program
- 1 PM French Immersion Kindergarten Program
- 1 All Day French Kindergarten Program (Tuesday/Thursday) we will add a program if numbers dictate
- 1 All Day English Kindergarten Program (Tuesday/Thursday) we will add a program if numbers dictate

Dear Parents:


