### **Evaluation**

A goal at Agnes Davidson is to create opportunities for students to learn and demonstrate active citizenship. We do this through our school wide assemblies, our donation drives we have which support various causes (Terry Fox, food bank, bottled water, winter clothing, etc.). We also engage in a school wide bake sale where the proceeds support a student in a Third World Country. Additionally, our grade 5 students pay acts of service by volunteering at the Soup Kitchen and our Kindergarten students engage in volunteering at our local retirement home on Halloween. In addition, students are involved in various sports clubs and fine arts clubs which require them to represent themselves and the school in the community. Even with these activities from the perspective of the stakeholders, the characteristic of citizenship is on the decline. A future goal will certainly be to highlight and showcase the acts of citizenship in which our school community is involved.

### **Evaluation**

When looking at the parent and teacher perspectives, we have dropped a bit in their views of Education Quality. This may in part be due to the new curriculum and teachers developing their self efficacy in what they are teaching. This means that as a school, we need to ensure that teachers are feeling more supported in what they are teaching. During this school year it is a goal to increase school based professional learning to be focused on the new curriculum. In addition, the division, as well as the provincial government, is providing additional professional learning. Over the course of the last three years, there is also a drop in the students' perspective but not as significant.

### **Evaluation**

Looking at the Access to Supports and Services, the students' perspective is maintained much more than the parent and teacher perspectives. Students are feeling that generally they do have access to the supports they need. However, both the parents and the teachers, although less so, feel as though the students do not have access to the supports. This could be a reflection of the current climate and the changes to the education system over the last few years and the decline in access and funding to a variety of services (OT, PT, speech, fewer EAs, etc.).

### **Evaluation**

An area of growth is supporting both parents and teachers in understanding how the skills being taught contribute to the lifelong learning of the students. As a staff, it will also be a goal to ensure that we are teaching our student about the impacts of their learning on their future.
